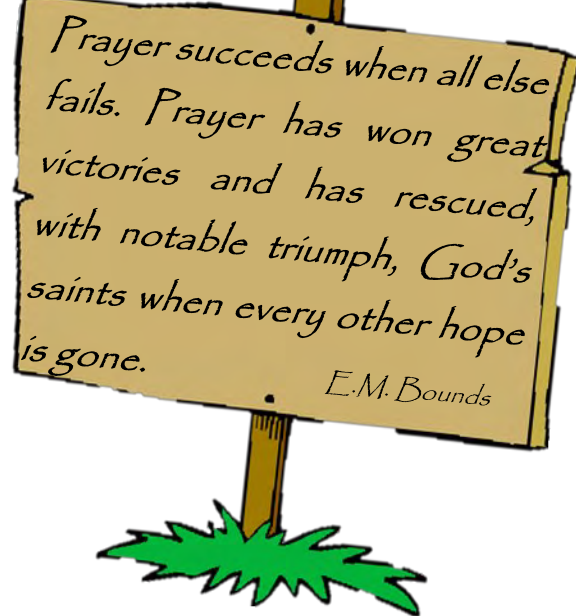

Pastoral Insights by Pastor Barry

"All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the Lord, and all families of the nations will bow

down before him, for dominion belongs to the Lord and he rules over all the nations." (Psalm 22:27-28) This is the future promise of the Lord that is yet to come.

It has been helpful to clarify that the word "nations" actually refers to "people groups" in the original language. This is true in Hebrew and reaffirmed in the Greek meaning also. We think of countries equal to nations but actually people groups point to "ethnicity." There are reported to be 17,000 people groups on earth

with 7,000 still lacking opportunity to hear and understand the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

As I have shared previously, I am blessed to be a part of a church that is aware of this and doing something to reach the unreached. There are 38 million Sundanese people in Indonesia and we are partnering with Pari and two house church pastors to share the Gospel with the Sunda people in a city known as Tasik. Please pray for Roy and Alfredo that they might be able to launch a house church in that city. They have been there for about two years still lacking enough interest and courage among the new believers to plant a house church. We prayed for them in church on March 22, but let's persist in prayer as Jesus said in Luke 18:1, "...always pray and never give up." (NLT)

While world powers debate peace, God is at work behind closed doors in Iran

Iran (MNN) – The Trump administration seems to be pursuing a diplomatic off-ramp to end the Iran conflict, even as strikes, troop movements, and regional tensions continue to escalate.

But inside Iran, there's another story unfolding.

John Cerniglia, President of SAT-7 USA, says Iranian believers inside and outside the country are

still finding ways to share Christ, even in secrecy.

"We understand, of course, in Iran that we're talking about the underground Church," he says. "There are no church buildings in Iran, but we understand there could be as many as a million underground believers. These are people who love Jesus, but who are unable to be public in most cases about their faith. So we hear from them because they watch our satellite television program."

Through satellite television broadcasts, ministries like SAT-7 reach homes across Iran with Christ's hope, even when other channels go dark.

Greetings and thanks to all our supporters and prayer partners. This year has presented such unexpected circumstances for Amani Fellowship. After seeking God and watching Him open and close doors, I decided it best not to travel on a mission's trip to Kenya this Spring. I am most boastful of God in the manner He prepared this situation. Having no full team from the US this year, I was in the process of gearing up an on-ground team of local ministry workers (**Shiloh Everlasting Grace Outreach Ministries and Victory Fellowship International**) to help with a celebration in the village. Further, with great enthusiasm and joy, Augustine is organizing a football (soccer) game

with several students for all to enjoy with soda and snacks. Honestly, my heart does ache with the realization that I will not be present for such a beautiful day orchestrated by God; however, Amani Fellowship is God's program, and He can and will use directly whom He selects. ***Our part this year is to fervently pray, support and boast in the wonders of God as we watch what He does for His orphans and others in a little village halfway across the world.*** It shall be a great day of celebration indeed!

So please keep Amani Fellowship in your prayers as the celebration day approaches. Also, continue to pray for direction from God on my potential travel to Kenya later this year. For now, we shall look forward to reports after the April 11th event along with pictures to have a fuller grasp of what God is doing through Amani Fellowship and local ministers in Kenya. We surely give Him all the glory!

Greetings from Brazil!

Happy Springtime!

Activities here are picking up after the slower Winter months. This last weekend we hosted a soccer tournament with boys from the community and a local church. We had an estimated 100 people here at our community center, Casa Luzeiro, with the kids, staff and volunteers. It felt so great to see the place full of life!

It was a great day of fun, laughter and intense competition. Brazilians really get into soccer and especially the boys who think soccer is life! We were able to fill the day with prayer, encouraging words and comfort for those who were in tears with lost matches. I didn't grow up playing soccer and yet, I loved watching the competition and cheering on our boys.

Many of these boys come from broken families and difficult circumstances and our big challenge for them was to compete without swearing or having any fights. I don't know a lot of swear words in Portuguese, but I



didn't see the boys being corrected by the other volunteers and there weren't any fights. The boys really rose to the challenge of playing with honor and integrity!

The same day as the soccer tournament we hosted our first family day at Casa Luzeiro. We invited just a few families that we've gotten to know to test out our idea of having an open house once a month for families to gather and connect with fun activities and in the future we hope to add basic parenting classes and that type of thing to help support healthy families. There are many single mom families and grandmas raising their grandchildren. I was impressed that two uncles showed up. I've noticed that there is a real absence of men involved in their families so it was great to see their involvement. As I chatted with people I found out that one single mom and her brothers (pictured below) were involved with the programs at Casa Luzeiro when they were younger. It's cool to hear how the ministry has now been here for 2 generations.

I was in charge of the activities and we had a lot of fun being crazy together. I was able to explain the directions in Portuguese and I'm so proud that they understood and that my language skills are improving!

Praise God for the newness of Spring and for the people I get to minister to!
