Who do you know from Paul's list of friends?

- * Tychicus = the confidant, trusted, close, confidential

 He called him, dear brother
- * Onesimus = the rookie, a new believer "a runaway slave" . . . forgiven
- * Brothers = the group, coworkers and comrades

Aristarchus was a <u>volunteer</u> prisoner "commitment"

Mark has been welcomed back "reconciliation"

- * Epaphras = the hero, inspirational

 "The Colossians learned of God's grace through him." (1:7-8)
- * Luke = so big; Demas = so small

 "He rubbed off on Paul" "He went away" (II Timothy 4:10)

 "Choose well"
